In Retrospect – Grants

Through grants, we support the important work of nonprofits in Greenville County. Over the past five years, we have granted over **\$900,000** through our Community Enrichment Grants and our cash contributions to the Greenville Women Giving grant pool.

Ninety grant requests have been funded by our Community Enrichment Grants during this time. These grants helped many good things happen. They started new programs. They continued good ones already at work. They provided matching funds to bring in more philanthropic dollars. Our goal is to help organizations have a real impact in our community. Here are three of their stories.



Meals on Wheels of Greenville, Inc. Project Transit Connect

Hot meals are needed for the elderly and disabled all over Greenville County. This project targeted delivery of meals to Taylors, Travelers Rest, Berea and the Furman area. Our grant of \$9,425 provided 20% of the total project cost for a part-time driver, cargo van and equipment to transport meals from downtown to four designated pick-up stations. Meals on Wheels now serves 423 clients in these areas, 80 more than before Project Transit Connect. It has also made it easier for the 393 volunteers to combat rising gas prices by driving shorter distances to pick up meals at the local centers. Tremendous support was received to fully fund this project and it is now included in the Meals on Wheels operating budget for the future.



Gateway House In-Home Medication Compliance Project

Gateway House assists adults with major mental illness to live independently in apartments they own or lease. One of the primary barriers to independent living is medication non-compliance and can often result in emergency room treatment, psychiatric hospitalizations, or incarcerations. The Community Foundation grant of \$12,300 helped fund staff to individually assist 50 residents every day to take psychotropic medications properly and consistently. By complying with their medication plan, they can participate more fully in life by going to school, working and living independently.



Greenville Tech Dreskin Medical Technician Laboratory

The Greenville Tech medical lab technician program needed software for four specialized computers and to replace a ten-year-old hemocue machine that measures hemoglobin in blood samples. The \$10,000 grant from the Community Foundation increased the program's capacity and created a realistic workplace environment with state of the art equipment. The Medical Lab Technician program was near capacity but with the addition of this equipment, four more students were added to each of eleven lab classes that are required for this associates degree program. The program has been highly successful with a 91% student retention rate and is located on the northwest campus of Greenville Tech in the Berea area.

Making a Difference

Fannie (Judy) Iselin Cromwell

Many of the beautiful places in Greenville bear the imprint of Judy Cromwell's hands and heart. She is a conservationist who works to preserve mountains and forests, rivers and green spaces and historic architecture.

Judy has long been a friend and fundholder at the Community Foundation. Her passion and support for the redevelopment of the Lake Conestee area helped secure a \$500,000 grant from the Community Foundation to purchase land for the park. Today, the Conestee Nature Park boasts 400 acres of woodlands and walking trails only 15 minutes from downtown. An amazing feat for land and water once damaged by pollution.

Judy has been involved with many local organizations and projects that make Greenville special – the beautiful green spaces in Falls Park on the Reedy, clearing the Swamp Rabbit Trail and planting shade trees with the Greenville Tree Foundation. She's served as a trustee of

Naturaland Trust and a supporter of the Nature Conservancy to develop the Mountain Bridge, a wilderness area in the northwestern corner of South Carolina. Judy is an artist, inspired by wilderness experiences and her conservation work, who has participated in Open Studios, supported the Metropolitan Arts Council and the Governor's School for the Arts and served on the board of the South Carolina Arts Foundation.

Her home, Brushy Creek Farm, is an extraordinary piece of property off Augusta Road. In 2010, she gave a conservation easement to Upstate Forever that will preserve the home built by Vardry McBee in the mid-1800's and will ensure that the surrounding 20 acres will never be developed. It's just the latest of her conservation efforts and another of her lasting gifts to Greenville.
