Greenville County Library Staff Education Fund in memory of Anthony Messineo

Application period opens February 15 and closes March 15

Award date is June 30

In 1994, community leaders and Library officials established a scholarship fund in memory of Anthony Messineo who served as Director of the Greenville County Library for eleven years. The scholarship fund provides financial assistance to staff members of the Greenville County Library who are seeking educational advancement through workshops, seminars, conferences, specialized course work, and/or a Masters Degree in Library and Information Science. The scholarship rewards distinguished service and reflects Anthony Messineo's deep interest in education and employee advancement.

Greenville County Fire Chiefs' Association Scholarship Fund

Application period opens February 15 and closes May 1

Award date is June 30

In 1995, the Greenville County Fire Chiefs' Association established a scholarship fund to promote higher education for firefighters and/or families of firefighters. Scholarships are available to active fire service personnel and the children of firefighting personnel who are interested in higher education in a fire service career as either a full-time employee or volunteer.

John I. Smith Charities Scholarship Fund

Application period opens February 15 and closes May 1

Award date is June 30

This scholarship fund was established in 1989 to provide educational incentives and financial assistance to individuals residing in government-subsidized housing. The goal of the scholarship is to help individuals achieve self-sufficiency and to become contributing citizens of the community. Funding for the scholarship is provided through a \$200,000 educational trust established by the John I. Smith Charities.

Applicant must be a high school graduate who resides in Greenville Housing Authority public housing, is enrolled as a student at a college, university, or technical school, demonstrates financial need and is not receiving a full scholarship. Award recipients are notified annually in July.

Rama Memorial Scholarship Fund for the Greenville City Fire Department

Application period opens February 15 and closes May 1

Award date is June 30

The Rama Family established the fund in 2006 with the purpose of providing undergraduate and vocational scholarships to students who are employees or children of employees of the Greenville City Fire Department.

Applicants must be full-time employees or the children of full-time employees who have worked for the Greenville City Fire Department for at least two years prior to the application deadline. A child whose parent/guardian is retired, deceased, or permanently disabled is also eligible to apply if the employee worked full-time for the City Fire Department for at least two years prior to retirement, death, or disability.

The Environmental Education Grant

*Application period opens **March 1** and closes **May 1***

*Award date is **June 30***

This scholarship fund was established in 1997 to benefit a person residing in Bermuda who intends to pursue a degree or diploma in the general field of environmental studies at a qualifying college, university, or other institution in the United States. It is designed to promote and encourage the study of conservation, ecology, agriculture, horticulture, and related subjects and to recognize the importance of promoting these subjects as they relate to the appreciation, enhancement and conservation of Bermuda's environment.

Applicants must be residents of Bermuda who are intending to attend an accredited college, university, or other educational establishment in the U.S., which is approved by the Grant Committee. The individual must plan to study conservation, ecology, agriculture, horticulture, or a related subject through a course or courses which are intended to lead to a degree or diploma in any of these subjects.

Brandon Warren Memorial Scholarship

*Application period opens **March 1** and closes **May 1***

*Award date is **June 30***

The Brandon Warren Memorial Scholarship fund was established to provide financial assistance for higher education to Varsity Basketball players graduating from Hillcrest High School.

Applicants must be a graduating senior and a member of the Varsity Basketball Team at Hillcrest High School, planning to attend a college, university, or technical school in South Carolina and demonstrate a financial need.
